THE NATIONAL CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP

Probably the best ever turn-out by Huncote Harriers in this annual race. This year the races were hosted in the Midlands and host club, Notts AC, led by Mick Robinson, put on a first class fixture at Wollaton Park. There were 10 races during the afternoon across all age groups from u/13 to senior men and women with a total of some 7700 runners.

There were some memorable Leicestershire performances during the afternoon: Gemma Steel looked comfortable winning the Ladies Senior race from her rival Steph Twell (AF&D) and helped Charnwood to second placed team medals; Ben Dijkstra (Leicester Coritanians) won the boys u/15 race; Leicester's Amy Griffiths, the County senior ladies cross country champion, and representing AF&D, was second in the junior ladies' race, and Charnwood won 1st place medals in the u/13 boys'.

For the Harriers, Julie Lamb is proving a great capture for our club and was first across the line. Another battle between Karen Selby and Trudi Unwin went to Karen Selby. For the men, Carl Sommer has put last year's injury disappointment behind him for another fine run and there

VIRGIN LONDON MARATHON 2014

One of the best Harriers performances for many a year in this year's London. Two runners, Carl Sommer and Mark Gregory achieved sub 3 hour clockings with Mark achieving a well deserved p.b.. Carl was just outside his best but had a good run considering his build-up was hampered with a bad cold.

There was some disappointment for Mel Evans as she failed to reach her sub-3 target but her run was still creditable. being the 4th best performance ever by a Huncote Harrier - only two runs by Nicki and one by Mel herself being better. Chairman, Andy Wilford weighed in with another exceptional run achieving another p.b. with 3-15-24. Further down the field. another fine London run for the second year on the trot was achieved by Julie West. Her 3-37-10 was a sizeable chunk off her best and moves her just outside the Huncote all-time top 10 best marathon runners. With some promising marathon debuts, all-in all a good club performance

In the elite race, Mo Farah had a great run to finish 8th in 2-08-21, the fastest debut marathon time ever by a British runner and not much further back was Chris Thompson who also had a fine marathon debut.
