Nicki Nealon continues to amaze and was first lady overall in the ladies' race and was only beaten by Nick Strange and Mark Kendrick amongst the Huncote men. It was a good run by Nick who has put together a good set

of results after losing much of the winter to injury.

By way of comparison the following is the result of the 1989 Hungarton 7 race held on 19th July that year, characterised by heat wave conditions. In those days the course started outside the village hall and went southwards: an immediate stiff climb out of the village followed by a sharp downhill stretch

to the Coplow Road.
From there the road climbs most of the way to Billesdon Coplow finishing with a very steep climb to the Tilton Road. From there it is undulating back to Hungarton via Sludge Hill. The race was won by course record holder Joe Masterson in 36-20 (the night was hot but Joe's course record was 34.1/2 minutes)

Also running that night were a number of people who were to join the Harriers and go on to better things in later years, namely, Mick Butler (Beaumont Leys) 42-23, Jack Angrave (Thurnby) 42-28, Mick Quilter (Road-Hoggs) 48-01 and Sue Edwards (Dee-Lux) 51-03.

In comparing the two race results the decline in standards for the men from the 1989 race to the 2015 race is staggering! In 2015 only 8 runners in the race were able to run inside 6 minute/mile pace. In 1989 the number was 49 including 11 from Huncote Harriers. Nick Strange was first Harrier to finish in 2015 with a time of 45-41 in 1989 there were 21 Harriers guicker than that time, and on a harder course! Interestingly, Nick Strange was 3.1/2 minutes slower than his dad in the 1989 race. It should also be noted that 502 runners completed the race in 2015 as against 302 runners in 1989. Much of the difference in race numbers between the two years is explained by increased participation by ladies in recent years: there were only 48 ladies in the 1989 race. Ladies' standards are roughly comparable with Nicki Nealon being faster in the 2015 race than Sue Clarke's winning time in the 1989 race. However, all our ladies in the 1989 race finished inside one hour whereas 5 ladies were outside one hour in the 2015 race.
