THE NATIONAL CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP

For the first time in its history the "National" was held by the side of **Donington Park Race** Circuit in Leicestershire. It proved to be an ideal venue as it provided a good undulating course; wide enough to avoid bottlenecks caused by large fields of runners, and capable of supplying sufficient amenities and car parking. Amongst the spectators praising the course was 1966 **Commonwealth Games** Marathon Champion and Olympic runner, Jim Alder, who declared the course to be a really stern test. He was especially pleased as his Morpeth Harriers team carried off the men's championship with two of their six counters, Nick Swinburn and Jonny Taylor finishing in the first six runners home. Morpeth were also first club in the 9 runners to score category. Aldershot Farnham & District proved yet again to be one of the country's top clubs providing the winners of the men's race, Jonny Hay, the ladies' race, Lily Partridge, and the Junior Men's champion, Ellis Cross. In

addition, they won 4 team championships during the afternoon, a fine result for the Surrey club.

The pick of the Harriers was perhaps Nathan Lawson in the Junior Men's race: he finished in 60th place and was well up the field. Mark Gregory was first home for the men but not too far behind were Gareth Chivers and the ever improving Warren Bennett. Sixth counter in the Huncote team was Graeme Slight, still going strong in his 14th "National". It was sad for the ladies as what looked to be one of their best ever teams was decimated in the weeks up to the race by illness and injury. All credit to Kathryn Evans, Wendy Thompson and Clare Moore for keeping the Huncote flag flying.

HARRIERS ULTRA RUNNERS - SIX OF THE BEST

Ultra running is generally considered to be running distances over marathon length (26.2 miles). Races can be on-road, off-road on paths and trails, and even on the track where perhaps the most common competition is a 24 hour race where racers try to run as far as they can in 24 hours.

Huncote Harriers have a good record at this type of racing and six of our best performers are detailed in this account. However, the list is not complete as other runners in our Club have made good contributions to our reputation: runners like Brian Mackey, Mick Butler, Jim Bates and Nick Nealon who raced vestervear in events like Haworth Hobble and Long Mvnd Hike; not forgetting Derek Milner who was a trailblazer at events on long distance footpaths and 24 hour races. Our ladies, too, have competed with Julie Frearson, Carol Hawkins and Bev Parry being the most notable

1. KEITH CHAMBERS (Marathon Best – 2-46-58)

A laboratory scientist in the N.H.S. Keith brings the same meticulous approach to running as he brings to his day job. He still runs every day and additionally cycles from his home in Croft to work at the Leicester Royal Infirmary more often than not. Keith has one of the best ultra records in the Harriers record book: the London to Brighton road race. In 1991 the race took him 7 hours 24 minutes 8 seconds. The course isn't exactly flat and is roughly equivalent to running two marathons back to back in 3 hours 25 minutes each plus another 4 miles! Although now in his late 50's Keith still competes at a high level recently having run in the 2016 National Cross Country Championship.

2. DAVE HAWCROFT (Marathon Best - 2-45-02)

Dave used to be a lecturer in Sciences at Leicester Polytechnic, having gained a Ph.D in Chemistry.

Never very guick over shorter distances but very competitive at marathon distance and above. He was something of a character being a keen student of beer drinking: particularly if it was Marstons and the pub was on or close to the A5 main road. His best performance was perhaps his 100K road race record at Lincoln in 1985 where he ran 8 hours 36 minutes 15 seconds. If anyone doubts how fast this is: try running 2 marathons back to back in 3 hours 35 minutes each and then add on another 10 miles for good measure! Training often included running to and from work which meant, as he lived in Sapcote, a round trip of 18 miles. Now resident in the Irish Republic Dave has retired from running

3. TREVOR LONGMAN (Marathon Best – 2-33-24)

One of the Harriers all-time greats on-road and off-road. Has won Long Mynd 50 Miles Hike on 3 occasions and is the fastest Harrier on that course (9 hours 12 minutes). This is a part night time trail race over most of the highest hills in Shropshire based around the Long Mvnd. He is the only Harrier to have successfully completed a Bob Graham Round, a circuit of 42 of the highest Lakeland peaks involving a distance of 66 miles with 29000 feet of ascent. The challenge starts and finishes at the Moot Hall, Keswick and has to be achieved within a 24 hour time limit. In 2000 he completed the circuit in 22 hours 32 minutes. Elsewhere, in 1997 he has won the Ulfkil Stride Race, a tough 33 mile race over Fountains Fell and Whernside in the Yorkshire Dales in a time of 5 hours 12 minutes. Trevor also has victories in the tough Stretton Skyline 20 mile Fell Race and Milford "21" trail race around Cannock Chase. He is a Life Member of the Harriers having been a key player in the establishment of our Club but moved to Stockport in 1998. In recent years a hip operation has curtailed his activities. To compensate he took up riding a bike but as his hip got better he soon

gave it up complaining that it lacked the buzz and excitement of running. These days Trevor is back on the fells doing the sort of running he enjoys in the Derbyshire Peak District and competes with moderate success for his local club, Macclesfield Harriers, in the V/60 age group.

4. CARL SOMMER (Marathon Best – 2-42-59)

Started running ultras at a younger age than usual and received a lot of advice from distance guru, Mark Wittering. Carl has run in some long races: one of the longest events in the country is the Thames Ring "250". As the name suggests it is a 250 mile race around the home counties and a race Carl completed in 2009 when he ran it in 91 hours 7 minutes to finish an excellent 7th place. Additionally, Carl has run multistage races in Europe, notably the Deutschlandlauf in Germany. This is a 17-stage race over a total of 748 miles. Cumulatively, Carl took 172 hours to complete the race to take 12th place out of 29 finishers. This meant a daily average of 44 miles to make even the best of us squirm. Similarly, he has run in the Transe Gaule race across France . Here the 18 stage race took him 144 hours to complete the 716 miles, an average daily mileage of just under 40 miles. Perhaps Carl's best run was competing in the East Hull Harriers 24 hour track race where he managed to cover 125.7 miles within the time limit and finished 2^{nd} in a field of 40. This is the Club 24 hour record. Still close to his racing prime Carl has moved from the Harriers to Hermitage Harriers to further his running career.

5. MARK WITTERING (Marathon Best – 2-38-08)

"Witto" is perhaps the most

prolific and successful of all Harrier ultra runners and was one of the founders of the Club back in 1983. Like Trevor Longman he has also won the Long Mynd Hike 50 a total of 3 times and has won other races. In 1991 in the 54 mile North York Crosses race he was joint first in 9 hours 19 minutes with Martin White One of his best performances was his run in the 2004 Grand Union Canal run of 145 miles in length. In this race he finished 3rd in a time of 33hours and 45 minutes and is still amongst the leaders on the race's all-time records' list. Another fine run was in the 1997 Downsman "100". This event runs the length of the South Downs Way plus a bit to make up the distance. In the 1997 race he finished joint 1st in 20 hours 17 minutes. Another outstanding run was in the 1998 Grantham Canal Run where he recorded 3-53-38 for the 33 miles course. In local events he has an enviable record in the Charnwood Marathon run organized by the L.D.W.A. where he has six consecutive wins on the trot from 2002 to 2007. Incidentally, marathon-wise, Mark is the only Harrier to complete the Snowdonia Marathon in under 3 hours aging round the course in 2-59-47 in 1997! His last major success came in 2007 when he recorded 5 hours 13 minutes with Carl Sommer for secondplaced team in the Wilmot Wander, a 32 mile race in Derbyshire.

For training, Mark is very much a Bradgate Park fan. His total mileage around there is probably close to 15,000 having run there regularly on Sundays over a period of 35 years. Mark hardly competes these days but still enjoys running around the Bradgate rough when free from injury.

6. MARTIN WHITE (Marathon Best – 2-51-58)

Being of light build and having an economical running action Martin White is the ideal model for ultra running. Another Harrier with an uncanny ability to keep going over a long period of time, he honed his long distance running ability by training and racing with Mark Wittering. He first competed in the Long Mynd 50 in 1988 and has competed in it 5 times since, his fastest time being 10 hours and 13 minutes. In this event he has been in the leading teams twice in 1990 (with John Cartwright, Mark Wittering, and Joe Faulkner (non Harrier)) and 1992 (with Mark Wittering, Trevor Longman and John Fine (non-Harrier)) He has competed 6 times in the Wuthering Hike (Haworth Hobble) 33 trail mile race over moorland Bronte country his fastest time being 4 hours 50 minutes in 1991. Also in 1991 in the 54 miles North York Crosses race he finished joint 1st with Mark Wittering in 9 hours 19 minutes. In 1992 in company with Trevor Longman he failed in an attempt on the Bob Graham Round: it was a baking hot day and they packed it in on top of Pillar after over 19 hours of running suffering from blisters. bruised toes and dehydration. One of his best performances was winning the Cloud 7 Race near Leek in 2000. The 28 mile course over peaks including The Roaches and Hen Cloud took him 6 hours 12 minutes. Nowadays, Martin still runs regularly competing occasionally in local LDWA events, and, maybe, in the occasional parkrun. Now a member of Leicester Tri Club, he takes a keen interest in his son. Mark's triathlon career.
