Jason Tomkins has improved as a cross country runner and looked strong as he took an excellent 12th place in

The Harriers had quite a good turn-out for this years races, very encouraging given the disappointing fields out in recent races. We had teams in the ladies' masters, the senior men's, and the masters' men's races. Perhaps the best performance was in the

masters men's race where we finished 4th team. On the afternoon, we thought we were in third place until a scoring error was found to put us a place further back. Individually, there were there some encouraging runs: Kathryn Evans was well up the field in the Ladies' masters. Katrina

Wightman has made considerable advances this year to finish second lady managing to get ahead of rival, Clare Moore, on the second lap. For the men, Duncan Shorthose ran his penultimate race in a Huncote vest to lead home the Club with Jason Tomkins not too far adrift. It was also encouraging to see some of our newer members taking

part.

A controversial topic in running is when runners in senior age groups are eliaible to become veterans (masters). In recent years the age has been lowered to 35 years of age although this limit is not universally applied. For instance, in the North Midlands Cross Country League, the men become veterans at 40 whilst the ladies are 35. In our county championship it is 35 for men and women. At the moment our club have few runners under 35 which is the reason why we entered a number of our masters men as seniors: in order to give our existing seniors. MIDLAND COUNTIES ROAD **RELAY CHAMPIONSHIP**

Every year in the spring time each area of the country promotes a 12stage road relay championship for men and, at the same time, a 6stage championship for ladies. As usual the midland event is at Sutton Park in Sutton Coldfield north of Birmingham on Saturday 25th March. Sutton Park is a large area of open parkland with metalled roads running throughout (closed to traffic) and has been the home of British relay running for the last 40 years since it became impracticable to run stage races like Manchester to Blackpool on main roads.

The last time we entered a team in this event was in 2004 and, up to then, this race was a regular fixture in our calendar. The men run their first 4 legs around a circuit of 5.4 miles and the remaining 8 legs are a circuit of 3.1 miles. The ladies run legs of 5.4, 3.1, 3.1, 5.4, 3.1, and 3.1 miles on the same road. It would be nice to resurrect our interest in this competition but we need runners who are able to run at a fast pace over these "short" distances. We would endeavor to enter our fastest runners in each team bearing in mind that we would be running against some of the fastest clubs and runners in the area, ie Tipton, Coventry Godiva, Bristol, Notts, Birchfield etc.

Whilst we are unlikely to be near the front in these races it would provide our runners with valuable experience racing against good opposition and might inspire better performances in local events. Another positive reason for entering this type of event is that it provides a focus for training to run fast and for personal improvement.

If you are interested please let me, Phil Watts, know. The cost is £84 per men's team and £42 per ladies' team which works out at £7 each. Ideally we need a surfeit of runners to cover the eventuality of runners dropping out because of injury, work commitments etc. A possible question mark against participation is a winter road league fixture at Desford the next day but our fixture list is overcrowded anyway. Team entry closes early March.

A controversial start to this new season. Not only do runners have to pre-enter races (before it was entry on the day) but it has become something of a lottery to get an entry at all as the race was oversubscribed. What is the point of having a series of inter-club league races if some of the main protagonists cannot get an entry!

With the increasing popularity of road running there might be 2 possible solutions: 1] limit clubs to a given number of entries and clubs would allocate runners as they think fit i.e. by lottery or on merit. 2]

make 2 divisions and have races on the same day. This might well be practical as there are now so many clubs in the league. Promotion and relegation issues would add to the attractiveness of the League; and it would enable newer clubs to organize and, therefore, profit from races

However, on to the race. Nathan Adams made a splendid start to his season as he sped around a tough course in under 6 minute/mile pace. Similarly, Kathryn Evans was also well up for the ladies. Another Huncote runner to do well was Barry Hibberd. Now in the V/60 category he was well clear of his closest rival and should be one of the main contenders in this age group. Irene Forty for the ladies is also a close 2nd in the F/65 age group. Chris Jordan of Leicester Coritanians won the race and, in the process, led home a strong team, finishing in front of Hermitage.
