## **VIRGIN LONDON MARATHON 2017**

Dave Bedford and past race directors of the London Marathon have generally produced some mouthwatering prospects as far as elite running is concerned and this year proved to be no exception. For the ladies, past winner, Mary Keitany of Kenya, was reputed to be in form and out to run a new World record. Likewise. Kenenisa Bekele of Ethiopia. arguably the greatest distance runner of all time, was out to add the men's World Marathon record to the 5000 and 10000 metres records he already holds - he already has the second fastest marathon time ever recorded.

Mary Keitany set out at an unbelievably fast pace and was soon clear of the field without the help of any pacemakers and was over a minute up on world record pace at half way. She was unable to maintain that fast pace but, although she slowed in the second half of the race, she was able to hold off the fast finishing Tirunesh Dibaba at the end of the race a remarkable piece of front running. Bekele was also up with world record pace at half way but he went through a bad patch and dropped out of the leading group. However, in the best traditions of a

fantasy comic story, he recovered and started to catch the leaders. Going into second place he relentlessly pulled back the Kenyan leader Daniel Wanjru and got to within 8 seconds. The Kenyan was able to raise his game in the closing miles and, with a last mile of 4-27, he held off the great Ethiopian distance runner.

For Huncote Harriers there was as much excitement with a big group of runners taking part and a large contingent of followers in the capital to offer support. Gaz Chivers. who had prepared assiduously for the race, ran well to be first Harrier home but failed narrowly to beat 3 hours. Only Jonny Oxbrough has managed to beat this target in the last 2 years. Andy Woolley was not far behind and was just 11 seconds slower than his Liverpool marathon time set in 2016. Claire Quigley. who has the second fastest marathon time for a Harrier (behind

Nicki Nealon) was fastest Harrier lady and was pleased with her effort being her fastest marathon for 6 years.

However, the run of the day probably belongs to Rachel Trivett. Her 3-39 puts her only 6 minutes off being on the Harriers all-time list of best 10 marathoners – a fine run on her debut at the distance.

### NATHAN LAWSON CRACKING RUN IN 2017 LIVINGSTON RELAYS

Huncote Harrier Nathan Lawson produced a stunning performance to run third fastest time of the day, 15-14, behind Joe Rainsford (Heanor) with 14-55 and Eddie Highton (OWL's) 15-04. This run which was just outside 5 minute/mile pace over a course of 3 miles is arguably the best performance by a Huncote runner for a good number of years. In other teams, V/60 Barry Hibberd had a fine

If running standards are to improve we need to encourage runners to do some consistent training through the winter months. Something to perhaps consider for next year?

Nicki Nealon, after a troublesome back injury, returned to racing action in this Wednesday evening race organized by Beeston AC in the south of Nottingham. Her 31-51 was good enough to be first lady home in 26<sup>th</sup> place overall. Race winner was Matthew Williams (Notts AC) in 25-51.

## Welsh 1000 Metre Peaks Race

This race used to be one of the hardest races on the FRA calendar and was often used as one of the long championship "A" races. In 1984 this race featured an epic struggle between fell running legends, John Wild and Kenny Stuart, who raced it hard all the way to the finish line. It was discontinued, probably through difficulty of organization and lack of support. In the 1980's the race was over the 4 1000

metre summits in Wales. Carnedd Llewellyn, Carnedd Daffydd, Crib y-Ddysgol and Snowdon a distance of 20+ miles with an ascent of 9000 feet. The race was revived in the new millennium but now includes a fifth four thousander, Glyder Fawr. This mountain has recently been resurveyed and found to be 1001 metres. The old race went past Llyn Ogwen and climbed to a lake overlooking it, Llyn Caseg Fraith. Now the route goes from Ogwen to the top of Glyder Fawr before proceeding to Pen-y-Pass youth hostel. The distance is about the same but there is extra ascent going over the mountain summit. The Harriers latest ultra star. Kent Butcher, ran in this year's edition and recorded an excellent 6-29-52 for the course. The race starts at sea level on the shore line at Aber on the North Wales coast. It's then upwards most of the way to the first checkpoint on the summit of Carnedd Llewellyn at 3499 feet, much of the route barely runnable. After a fairly easy ridge run around to Carnedd Daffydd there is a steep awkward descent to Llyn Ogwen. After negotiating Glyder Fawr and cross country trails to Pen-Y-Pass there is a sting in the tail in the climb up to Snowdon Summit visiting Crib-y-Ddysgol (Carnedd Ugain) on the way.
